Sunday November 8th

Welcome to Sunday morning worship. Today is Remembrance Day and the churches in Dronfield (CTDD), on their Facebook page, are live streaming the open air act of Remembrance at the War Memorial outside of the Library. The service will begin at 10:55am and will finish by 11:15am. Please watch the service, as well as our own, and tell as many people who may have wished to be present, but because of the restrictions are unable to, where they can see it. This is the 75th Anniversary of the end of the war in Europe on 8th May 1945 and the restrictions we are all living in at the moment make for a very different and poignant moment of the year to then. The Christmas ritual I am focussing on today are the evergreens we use to decorate our homes which remind us of the life we know in Jesus when all of creation around us seems to be asleep. As it is Remembrance Day as we will also be thinking of the poppy which reminds us of the horror of war as well the hope we can all share in of the day when all wars will cease and peace will reign. Remembrance Sunday



I have just read General Sir William Slim's book about the war in Burma, something that my Dad never talked about. He never collected his medals, but I having sent away for them, now have them. I also wrote off for his war records, which tell me where he trained in India and when he entered the Theatre of Operations. But it doesn't tell me where he was and which battles in Burma he fought in. Having now read the book, I now know roughly what my Dad had to do and put up with while he was there. He crossed the River Chindwin at Mawlaik north of Kalewa and then they went down to Mandalay. He arrived back from Burma on 9th August 1945 and was sent to Germany with the 58th Royal Armed Corp (Royal Scot Greys). He left Germany in February 1946 and was de-mobbed on 27th March 1946. 11 months after VE Day.

In General Slim's book he wrote the following: 'Campaigning in Burma, its appalling weather, huge distances, rampant diseases of every kind, the strange jungle environment, combined to create a sense of hardship which could not fail to depress morale. The epithet "The Forgotten Army" was taken up by the troops and before it became a statement of pride it reflected the fears and frustrations of soldiers thousands of miles from home whose hardships and deprivations were not widely appreciated.
