

There will be crafts for the Kids with Cake & Tea/Coffee at the end of the service.



How do you measure up?

I've got to 1 Corinthians 13 in my "Read the Bible in a Year" - most folk are familiar with the passage even if they are not committed Christians. I've read it, and heard it read out and preached on many times. I might even have preached on parts of it myself. I think it's probably the most frequently used passage of Scripture in church weddings. It expounds and sings about the nature and qualities of love. There are 16 qualities of love mentioned. Love

- is patient,
- is kind
- does not envy
- does not boast
- is not proud
- does not dishonour others
- is not self-seeking
- is not easily angered

Nicky Gumbel tells of a missionary who used these qualities as a monitor of her growth as a Christian. She would put her name at the front of each quality and meditate on how she stood with that quality. Her ambition was one day to go through the list and know each one applied to her. If we are made in God's image then these are the qualities we should be showing too.

I got one of those light bulb moments and was reminded how important it is for Christians to avoid complacency by taking stock, from time to time, and applying some form of Biblical plumbline to their walk with Jesus. I fell at the first hurdle and got a serious dose of reality! What's worse I realised that if I asked the family they would agree with my analysis!

I've matured enough as a Christian to know not to beat myself up when God points out my failings but to learn the lesson, allow Him to dust me down, and with the Spirit's help rely on Him more closely so that the next time I try the list I do better.

Imagine what the world might look like if even one of those qualities was taken up by each nation. Coming out of formal lockdown is an excellent opportunity for us to take stock individually and as a fellowship. How well would you do putting your name at the start of each quality? More importantly what will you then do about it?
