


New Monday Fellowship Group for 2022

Thought for the Week

Love always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. 1 Corinthians 13:7

Do you make New Year resolutions? I tend not to because I am so bad at keeping them! However, one area in which I know I need to improve is in my prayerful concern for the Christian family across the world.

At the start of each year Open Doors produces a list of the countries where it is most costly to follow Christ. The January booklet this year starts with the verse above with an emphasis on perseverance: "You and I may not be called to persevere in the same way as our brothers and sisters in North Korea, Afghanistan and other countries - but we are called to persevering prayer. It makes such a difference for our persecuted family to know we are faithfully standing alongside them, for the long term"

In this country we still have a lot of freedom to follow Christ, but we should beware of taking this for granted. Society's attitudes are changing in ways which may lead to far less freedom of speech, or to follow Bible principles. However, while we have this freedom let us challenge ourselves to use it to support Christian brothers and sisters who are being persecuted.

Two excellent organisations to get more information are Barnabas Fund (Barnabasfund.org) and Open Doors. Open Doors launch this year's Watch List with a parliamentary presentation on Wednesday 19 January, followed by a prayer webinar the same evening at 8.15pm which is open to everyone. If interested just register beforehand at opendoorsuk.org.

So, let us stand with our brothers and sisters and say: "I know that my Redeemer lives and that in the end He will stand on the earth." Job 19:25

Video streaming is now being used successfully and will be a major benefit to many people who can't attend services in person. We do however need everyone who may be likely to appear on video at the front to sign a form to give us permission to video them and broadcast it on YouTube. Anyone who participates in a service including the music group and anyone taking the offering, need to sign, if this isn't done then you haven't given permission and the broadcast cannot go on YouTube, once signed it will last 3 years, then reviewed.

Forms will be available on Sunday for you to sign. If you are signing for a family please note that the age of consent for data use like this in the UK is 13, so please sign on behalf of children who are younger than 13 and get all 13 and overs to sign for themselves.

If you do not want to appear on camera please be aware of the area of church that is not in shot, if you need to go into the front part of church please inform the camera man.
