

Thought for the Week 26th June

When I first sat down to write the 'Thought for the Week' I was going to focus on what I named as "turbulent times", from Pandemic to Ukraine. Having tried to write something constructive on that theme and failed, the next morning came a gift of an email. It was from Kat the lead member of the outdoor education staff at Ringsfield Hall, Suffolk where Ross and I lived and worked for 18 years. She wanted to share some of the responses of the 9–10-year-old children, from London, who are staying at Ringsfield this very week.

(Just a quick explanation, if you haven't seen or heard an explanation of the name "Magic Spots"). Without long involved explanations (which I'm very good at!), "Magic Spot" is the name given to the time when the children and their leaders each find a place in the woods, the meadows standing or sitting in silence alone, out of sight and sound of anyone else, for anything from five or ten minutes to twenty minutes or more.

The children normally take pencil and paper to write or draw, but this is never to be understood as part of their writing and drawing skills, to be marked by their teacher! However, thankfully, many children want to share what they have experienced. So here at last is the Thought (or thoughts) for the Week. Three children 9 or 10 years old, experiencing nature:

- ✚ ***I'm feeling so fresh a new me, understanding things***
- ✚ ***I feel confident, calm and independent***
- ✚ ***As I stare around me things blur into a picture of love, hate and the cycle of life***

So, after all I am focusing on turbulent times. So, in these turbulent times find a "magic spot", or a place beside the still waters, find a "new understanding of things", revitalise your confidence, discover independence in a calm spirit and contemplate the cycle of life.

When we do this as the children teach us, then we will be more ready to respond to and share the pain of our turbulence of the world.
