Thought for the Week

I left you last time with the words Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Phil 4:4 I had actually forgotten that was my last sentence, until I came to write today, with these verses in I Thessalonians 5:16-18 in my mind Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is

God's will for you in Christ Jesus. So, God clearly hasn't finished with me in the area of rejoicing. These verses have been in my mind for a couple of weeks as something made me think about the ease with which we do exactly the opposite. It is much easier to moan and complain, to worry and be anxious, to be ungrateful and resentful. We question 'why me?,' 'why can't I have what they have?' or mutter 'it's not fair!' at the drop of a hat. As we read the Psalms and the Epistles, though, it is very clear that God's desire is for us to rejoice in all circumstances. This doesn't come easily and has to be a conscious act of will. When something goes wrong, we have to learn to say, 'And I will rejoice' Psalm 9:2 (and many other places in both the Old and New Testaments). Learning strategies to cope with disappointment or difficulties is not a bad thing. Sometimes the words of a song can help to turn our minds to Jesus and counteract negative feelings. To sing to yourself 'This is the day, this is the day, that the Lord has mad. I will rejoice, I will rejoice and be glad in it' can really put positivity into your thoughts. I am sure you will have songs that are personal to you that can help to fill your mind with thankfulness, rather than bitterness or sadness. I challenge and encourage you (and myself) to rejoice always and give thanks. God knows what is good for us and it is better for our souls to rejoice in Him than anything else. There is a very old hymn which includes the words, old fashioned maybe, which I leave with you

My sin, oh, the bliss of this glorious thought! My sin, not in part but the whole Is nailed to the cross, and I bear it no more Praise the Lord, praise the Lord, o my soul! It is well, it is well with my soul **Alison Bygrave**
