A Thought for this week:-

Red Sea

A holiday sermon included the reading from Exodus about the day before the crossing of the Red Sea. The Israelites had left Egypt after the dramatic events of Passover and God has led them for several weeks on a strange wandering route (in a previous home group we tried to track this on a map and it seems to make no sense at all, wandering around but never getting very far away!). Eventually they reach the banks of the Red Sea with the Egyptian army right behind them, intent on slaughter! The Pillar of Fire moves between the two armies for the night. We are so familiar with the outcome on the following day that it is easy to miss the real impact of this event. To summarise: God starts with a miraculous departure from Egypt, then leads them for several months on a seemingly pointless rambling journey which ends in a fatal trap. All is lost, there is no escape! God then tells them to trust him and have a good night's sleep!

Probably our lives are less dramatic than this but there are still times when we don't understand where God is leading us, and things seem to get worse and worse until we can see no way out of a particular problem. We pray but nothing gets better.

It is in these situations that God challenges us to trust in Him. I suspect that if the Israelites had been led straight into the desert, they would have coped even worse than they eventually did, they needed time to settle into a nomadic lifestyle before the full rigours of the desert. They were then given an even more spectacular miracle to set them on the way again. This should have enabled them to really trust, though we know this only lasted until the next insoluble problem faced them!

So what about us? Can we trust God when things seem impossible? Do we still have a good night's sleep when things go wrong?

Moses answered the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand firm and you will see the deliverance the Lord will bring you today. ... The Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still." Exodus 14:13-14 NIV
