

Thought for the week

Alison Bygrave

A phrase which has been on my mind recently has been 'In the midst of Life we are in Death' which I thought was from the Bible, maybe in Job. After some searching, I discovered it comes from the Book of Common Prayer), not a usual source for me. It is part of the funeral service and continues with the thought 'To whom look for may we help, but from you, Lord, who for our sins are justly displeased?

I found some interesting articles on this theme, one written in 2020 when we were in the midst of the covid pandemic. Martin Davie, writing for the Latimer Trust says 'The important thing to note here is that these words are not just referring to life in a time of pandemic. They are referring to what is generally true for all human beings at all times and everywhere.' (Theological reflections on the pandemic. Part 2.)

It is hard to accept the only certainty in life is death, and our current population does a good job of sanitising it, denying it and trying to ignore it. In the same way we all ignore the words of Jesus in Luke 14:20-21: Once, on being asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, Jesus replied, "The coming of the kingdom of God is not something that can be observed, nor will people say, 'Here it is,' or 'There it is,' because the kingdom of God is in your midst.

If you are assured that this is true, then death doesn't have the same power over 'Where, death, 0 you, is vour victory? Where, O death, is your sting?' (I Cor 15:55) Sudden death or death of a loved one is still hard to deal with, but we can be sure that our God is walking with us in the valley of the shadow of death and he is still our rock and our refuge, the great Lord who is most worthy of our praise.

Romans 15:13

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Prayer Chain

Andy made a glancing mention of a prayer chain in his sermon last week and it occurred to me that not everyone will realise that they can be a member of our church prayer chain which has been running since 1985 (I think).

It began as a result of a Women's Wednesday morning Bible study, in which we studied a book called 'What happens when women pray' by Evelyn Christensen. In those days we had an A4 sheet of rules and it was a telephone chain, with two leaders who started the message down the chains. Over the years we became more familiar with technology as it evolved into an email chain which made many of the rules irrelevant as there was no longer room for Chinese whispers to creep in. The last telephone chain finished in February 2015 and since then it has operated by email with these basic rules.

- 1. Pray faithfully and fervently James 5:16
- 2. Pray God's will
- keep 3. Be discreet requests confidential. There two are categories of requests, Prayer Chain only which means they are not to be shared outside the prayer chain and Prayer Chain Request which means they can be shared for prayer with the church. Don't gossip.
- 4. Permission from the originator or subject of the prayer is required, wherever feasible

The Prayer Chain is one of the support structures of our church; if there is an urgent prayer need, an email will be sent by Gill Smith or Alison Bygrave and we will unite in prayer.
