
## **Leadership Elections**

### Thought for the week

<u>'The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be</u>
<u>with your spirit'</u>
Philippians 4 verse 23

Paul's final words in his letters to the churches, apart from one letter, all end very much like this. What Paul wants to linger in their hearts and minds as they hear the letter being read to them is this little word grace. This explosive little word is the best word to have left ringing in their ears as you leave, though it is also one of the most demanding and difficult words too.

It is the best word, because it describes completely and utterly how God loves us and treats us. God loves us and treats us never according to what we deserve. God loves us and treats us never according to what we have done or what we have not done. God loves us and treats us never according to how long we have known him or served him or loved him. He loves us and treats us only according to the measure of his grace for us. This is why John Newton was right to describe this by using the word 'Amazing'.

Grace is something truly amazing, isn't it. It is amazing to know that when we wake up each and every day, we have a completely brand-new start with God. As the sun has gone down and risen, so God chooses to treat us today as if yesterday had never happened. He yearns for us to dare to believe this is how he thinks and acts towards us and that he doesn't act like how we would in the same situation.

This is why this mind-blowing little word is so hard to believe, why it is so truly Amazing because it is so counter intuitive to how we would normally believe and behave. But this is where the rub really lies. When we think of grace, we are not

only to think of how God treats us we are reminded that this is how we are to treat each other too.

When Paul speaks of grace as he finishes his letters, he does so because he wants to leave them on a high where they are lost in wonder, love and praise. But his pastoral heart beating in him prays for more than that. His heart beats with the prayer that they will seek to live out this way of Jesus in their life as a community and as they bear witness to and experience the presence of the risen Jesus in their midst to the world around them.

May we wish to know the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ in a similar way and for all who we meet to know this same grace in their lives too.
