Forgiveness and Disagreements

Then Peter came to him and asked, "Lord, how often should I forgive someone who sins against me? Seven times?" "No, not seven times," Jesus replied, "but seventy times seven! Matthew 18:21-22

This verse is well known to us and I am sure we are all aware of the challenge. Peter thought he was being very generous in being prepared to forgive his brother 7 times. Jesus' response was to give a vastly greater number; translations differ as to whether this was 77 times or 70 times 7 (490) times, but either way I am sure it meant keep forgiving until you have lost count of the number of times, then keep on forgiving anyway.

However, in a sermon on holiday a few months ago this reading was followed by one from Paul's Epistle to the Romans. He says:

Who are you to condemn someone else's servants? Their own master will judge whether they stand or fall. And with the Lord's help, they will stand and receive his approval Romans 14:4

Here he was talking about several issues where Christians disagreed - such as eating food offered to idols, or which day to observe as the Sabbath. He continues:

So why do you condemn another believer? Why do you look down on another believer? Remember, we will all stand before the judgment seat of God. For the Scriptures say, "'As surely as I live,' says the Lord, 'every knee will bend to me, and every tongue will declare allegiance to God."' Yes, each of us will give a personal account to God. So let's stop condemning each other. Decide instead to live in such a way that you will not cause another believer to stumble and fall.

This is a somewhat different challenge to that of forgiving someone who has wronged us. It is about judging someone who we disagree with!

Here at DBC we are facing a number of changes in the way we do things. I am sure each of us will agree with some and disagree with others. Paul's challenge to each of us is to be prepared to accept that my view is no more, or less, valid than that of those making the changes.

We are to remember that our unity in Christ is of primary importance and how we run the services, which hymns we sing, how long the sermon is... are of secondary importance.

Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples. John 13:35
