

Thought for the week - Don

Stand your ground

"The mighty oak is only a little nut that stood its ground". A simple quote used by many motivational gurus and preachers - including in my Bible reading notes. A simple quote that says so much and certainly has relevance to Christians trying to live a Christ-like life.

Increasingly what Paul said in his second letter (chapter 4:3) to Timothy warning of the dangers of drifting from the Truth and God's revelation in His Word is a current issue. Christian standards, once the backbone of the British legal system and a marker for behaviour, are increasingly being relegated to just another opinion as valid as anyone else's.

Society is continually challenging us to conform to their standards. Legal good intentions like Equality and Anti-discrimination laws are being used to push minority agendas. Media have reported incidents of Christians standing their ground and then being taken to court or penalised by those with different views and an agenda to promote.

Christians have a continual battle summed up in the old saying "if you always do what you've always done, you'll always be in the same place". How do we distinguish between listening to the Holy Spirit telling us to move and the chaos of change for the sake of change? For a Christian, standing our ground is safeguarding who Jesus is, His teaching and the importance of God's Word, whilst at the same time being constantly open to the Spirit prompting changes to ensure relevance and meaning to the world we live in.

Paul gave Timothy some sound advice in his first letter to Timothy (also in chapter 4) to encourage him and protect him and us from the pressure to conform and compromise.

Don't be complacent. Continue to actively mature in your relationship with Jesus (4:7)

Practice what you preach (4:12). Live a life that honours God.

Does it contradict what we know is true from God's Word and the example of Jesus' life? (4:16)

If in doubt our role model is Jesus. He never took the easy or popular option if it meant compromising His teaching. He always kept in tune with God's plans by His prayer life. He lived out what He preached.

We stand our ground as we engage more with Jesus, so enabling us to introduce others to Him and thus enrich our community. Wonder where I've heard that before?
