

Thought for the Week

Explaining God:

People are obsessed with trying to explain our God. The problem is if you could explain God He wouldn't be much of a God!

My reading notes are taking me through Revelation at the moment and it is making me think about how futile it is trying to explain God. Unanswered questions fill me with awe. They also challenge me that I have to accept my own limitations - I will never fully understand God and each bit of understanding I do get is a privilege. Having a perfect answer would just diminish God.

I suppose we might be able to explain some of the mechanics of things eventually but looking around me, once we get an answer to one question it opens up many more questions just showing how little we understand. Even if we were able to iron out all the "how" questions, the mechanics, the physical laws it just shows how wonderful God is. The fact that we can determine laws of physics and chemistry is a major stumbling block to those who try to prove that we are accidents. Yes, we might understand a little more about the way God does things but that's just the "tip of the iceberg" in trying to understand God. inspiring The unanswerable awe questions start in Genesis not Revelation and go right through God's Word. God spoke and chaos became creation. God just spoke ... (chapter 1).

It seems a human trait that we try to and explain rationalise away the miraculous things instead of praising God for them. The Exodus crossing over on dry land or the range of prophets and their warnings plus their looking forward Finally there's faith Jesus. in to Revelation. Anyone who fully can

understand everything there has my respect. Most are like me - we're ok with the first three chapters then we scratch our heads.

Another human trait we have is taking miracles for granted. We don't understand or explain God's involvement - we just ignore it! I'm sure we've all observed examples around us.

Try explaining why God loves us individually. That one blows my mind for two reasons. Why on earth should God love a world that has fallen so badly from His creation? Secondly there are billions of people at any point in time so together since creation numbers are incalculable yet God loves me - just one individual in all that. God loves you as one individual. One unique individual in our fellowship, family, your your friends and acquaintances, this town, the UK etc. Does that fill you with awe?

Try explaining why God loves us so much that He intentionally and deliberately sent His only Son to earth to die just so that <u>you</u> could have a personal relationship with Him. If that doesn't fill you with awe what will? How can you explain that?

It's not a cop out to accept we can't explain God. It is rightly humbling. It is rightly awe inspiring - even celebrating. Meditate on the implications of our verse and just be thankful and reflect that back to God in praise.
