Thought for the Week From Alison Bygrave Offer to God a sacrifice of praise



Since the earliest times, music has been part of humanity's relationship with God. Genesis 31 and Exodus 15 mention music and singing, as normal things in life. Many of the psalms have been sung ever since they were written. Not everyone enjoys or relates to music, but God ordained it as a part of worship. 2 Chronicles 29:28 says the whole assembly bowed in worship, while the musicians played and the trumpets sounded. All this continued until the sacrifice of the burnt offering was completed,

All through history men and women have written music and songs to worship God and enable others to worship too. Some of the words can really help us to worship God, no matter when the hymn was written, especially when the music fits really well and appeals to our senses. I think there are songs in every generation that just hit the spot, and become popular, as they seem to express the mood of the age. There are others which are timeless and speak to the heart of worship irrespective of when they were written. There are others which, in my opinion, need to be lost forever. I have a 'Sacred Songs and Solos' music edition which doesn't have a publication date but must be from 1900, at the latest. Hymns like 'Before Jehovah's awful throne' or 'Hark the temperance bells are ringing,' sit alongside 'Blessed Assurance' and 'How sweet the name of Jesus sounds.' Some are so dated but others still resound for us.

Sometimes a new song comes along, and I think this is a nice song but what is its biblical reference? I like singing it but what is its scriptural basis? So, it was with the song 'The goodness of God' which repeats 'keeps running after me.' I know God's goodness runs throughout the Bible, but I wasn't sure about it running after me, so out came the concordance. And I learnt 'The scripture that says "Surely goodness is running after me" is a misquote of Psalm 23:6. The correct verse is "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life'. The Message uses the word 'chase.' Essentially then the song is based on Psalm 23.

We will all have our favourites, and our disliked hymns but the bottom line is: God calls us to worship him and give a sacrifice of praise. It helps us when we enjoy the singing but as Hebrews 13:15 says

Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise—the fruit of lips that openly profess his name.
