

Thought For the Week

One year we were on holiday in Menorca on Palm Sunday. We went to a village up in the mountains which was famous for its macaroons. The scenery was incredible and the air was so fresh and invigorating. The thing that I remember most is the crowds of people coming out of church waving palm branches in the sunshine. There was a very real sense of occasion and worship.

Matthew 21 says in vv7-11, They brought the donkey and the colt and placed their cloaks on them for Jesus to sit on. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted,

"Hosanna to the Son of David!"

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked, "Who is this?"

The crowds answered, "This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee.

The Bible Gateway resource tells me that Hosanna expression isa Hebrew meaning "Save!" which became an exclamation of praise, and my dictionary says it is an adoring cry. I fell into a bit of a rabbit hole researching when it began to be used and what it really means. Vocabulary.com for example tells me, `A hosanna is statement or а of exclamation praise. Usually, hosannas praise God. The noun hosanna referring to a cry of praise can claim a long pedigree in English: it first appeared in the 12th century. It's from a Biblical Hebrew phrase meaning "Pray, save us." Hosanna made stops in Greek and Latin before arriving in English in the earliest translations of the Bible. Any kind of thanks and adoration aimed at God could be considered a hosanna. In church, many of the prayers and songs are hosannas.'

To us it is a very church based, maybe outdated word, but imagine you were in Jerusalem on that day when Jesus arrived. The sun shining, the excited crowds, the fulfilment of a prophecy, (Zechariah 9:9*), the hope of salvation. Wouldn't you want to shout and 'Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever' (Psalm 118:29). And use a word to praise him in unison with our fellow believers down through the centuries.

*'See, your king comes to you, gentle and riding on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.'
