Thought for the Week The disciples asked Jesus 'Master teach us to pray'

Luke 11 1-13

Jesus said 'this is how you should pray' verse 1-4, and He taught us The Lord's Prayer.

Then in the next breath Jesus goes on to tell us the story of the man who goes to his neighbour's house in the middle of the night and the neighbour sends him away.

I always thought this was rather harsh and not like God at all.

However, Jesus goes on to tell us that the neighbour, i.e. God, will answer if we are persistent.

Still a bit difficult to get my head round.

V9 says 'So I tell you keep on asking, and you will be given what you ask for.

Keep on looking and you will find what you are looking for.

Keep on knocking and the door will be open to you.

For everyone who asks, receives. Whoever seeks finds. Whoever knocks the door will be opened.

Then the best bit when Jesus tells us that if we know how to give good things to our children how much more so does God love to give us good gifts. How much more will our heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him.

We have been thinking through Lent about Unanswered prayer.

What can we learn from this passage?

Do we simply ask and not put enough effort into our prayers.

We are told in other places that we should join together to pray, that we should confess our sins to one another.

Small groups, church prayer meeting, being open and trusting with one another.

All pretty scary.

But possibly a way forward.

It takes effort to ask, it takes more effort to seek (you have to get up and go somewhere), it takes even more effort to knock (dare we go to out on a limb, be bold with our prayers).

Maybe we should be more intentioned in our joining together to pray.

The Holy Spirit came to the disciples when they were gathered together.

Master, teach us to pray.

Seek ye first the kingdom of God and all these things will be added unto you.
