Thought for the Week

It's personal.

I've begun to sense a real moving of the spirit in our church life in the last few weeks. Without being given a theme, the messages from our guest speakers have worked powerfully together, blending with our worship and mid-week teaching. And it's been personal for me, has it been for you? I haven't been able to just sit, listen and think that's good or interesting; I've felt that there is a personal take home message for me.

Sally's message talked about the power we all have as believers to spread the gospel. We have the power of the spirit as Joshua's message told us and we have our own testimonies. So how am I going to use it and who am I going to talk to in a truthful, honest and vulnerable way? It's personal.

I can't get the two images that Mark used out of my head. First the powerful horse which is able to do such magnificent work because it is "broken" and fully in tune with its master. They know each other so well that the horse only needs the slightest pressure on the bit or through the rider's feet to know exactly what to do. An untamed horse is practically useless. So, what areas of my life do I need to yield to Christ? I know I have some and I'm working on them. It's personal.

And then the second image Mark used of a man in a desert reaching out for a drink of water. Am I hungry and thirsty enough for God's word and action in our needy world. What am I desperate for in kingdom terms as Gerhard has talked about? I know I'm desperate for my children and grandchildren to know Jesus and to have this power and comfort in an increasingly Godless and dangerous world. If nobody stands up, how are we going to turn the tide? It's personal.

And I know I want to do this in fellowship with my brothers and sisters in Christ. And it's not just in church. Ali often plays the piano and sings songs at home. The one that has really hit home recently is Trust and Obey with the emphasis on Obey. It's personal.

Trust and obey, for there's no other way To be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey.
