Thought for the Week

Guardian?

Psalm 121:5 uses the word Keeper (AMP/ESV), Guardian (MSG/NAMBRE), Protector (CEB/CEV), Watches over you (NIV) to describe God's overwhelming commitment to our wellbeing attempting to convey an image of God's protection. Synonyms of each other expressing taking on board responsibility for someone else's welfare and safety. For me the most helpful (and challenging) is "Guardian". If you investigate the concept of Guardianship, it has deep implications for Christians.

A Guardian is appointed legally when someone has "incapacity" or perhaps "vulnerability" is a better word. Incapacity prevents us achieving our full potential. If you don't have incapacity, you don't need a guardian. A Guardian must legally and morally protect their charge, act appropriately to protect them, keep them safe and keep them from danger - 24/7/365. Guardians can be appointed by a court to look after someone else who can't look after themselves.

Parents are legally guardians of their children as well as parents. We are God's children (John 1:12: 1 John 3:1; Ephesians 1:5 etc) and as such God Himself is our Guardian. God chose to be our guardian.

Our incapacity as Christians is sin. Sin twists our thinking; we are always the centre of our world. Our sin prevents us being the people God designed us to be and cuts us off from relationship with Him.

As our Guardian God did something about our incapacity - our sin - so that we could return to relationship with Him. He made a plan; Jesus is that plan. The Old Testament gives hints as to what that plan might be. The New Testament shows the implementation and consequences of that plan. As the plan, Jesus' life, death, resurrection and ascension blasted open the opportunity to return to relationship with God.

Fulfilling their duty of care a Guardian may not always agree with their charge. Our incapacity drives us to think we are always right. We often present God with our solution and take the hump if our prayer isn't answered in the way we want it to be. The Guardian has to take the big picture. Has to see what their charge perhaps can't see. We are not in the same league as God. He alone is GOD. His wisdom is as superior to our wisdom as we are to a flea. He is the only one who sees the big picture, the consequences of solutions to prayer.

We might not agree with God, we might get frustrated with His apparent ignoring our solutions but NOTHING can separate us (Romans 8:38 & 39) from His love or His COMMITMENT to our wellbeing (Romans 5:8). He is our true guardian. He is faithful and we can trust Jesus to walk with us through all situations (Hebrews 3:5) in which we find ourselves.
