The Topsy Turvy Kingdom

In the same way, the tongue is a small thing that makes grand speeches. But a tiny spark can set a great forest on fire. James 3:5

Starting a quarrel is like opening a floodgate, so stop before a dispute breaks out. Proverbs 17:14

Love prospers when a fault is forgiven, but dwelling on it separates close friends. Proverbs 17:9

I apologise if this thought comes out a little disconnected. I started with a thought from my daily reading but other related thoughts have cropped up over the days since and I'm trying to put them together. I have found it hard to write as it sets a standard so hard to

live up to. It's a bit long but please read it to the end! Please read the whole passage in James 3. Our words have enormous power for good or for bad, and James urges us to think carefully about what we say - every word has an effect on those around us So we start with gossip, just passing on stories about other people, which show them in a (slightly?) unfavourable light. It is so easy to do especially if we are feeling a bit annoyed at the time. Also, we are usually happy to listen to others, and even pass it on. But we all know the effect of Chinese Whispers! And what about criticizing the way things are run, or those who are running them. It is easy to criticise, much harder to stand up and try to make a difference. Proverbs 16:28 says A troublemaker plants seeds of strife; gossip separates the best of friends. Nicky Gumbel's comment on this was: Just as receiving stolen goods is as serious a crime in the eyes of the law as theft; so, listening to gossip is as damaging as gossiping. Why do we do it? Because others around us do? To let off steam? Because it's a good story? Are we tempted (probably subconsciously) to feel that putting someone else down makes us seem a little better comparison? Is it to find someone who shares our grumble? ... Are we genuinely doing it out of love for the person we are talking about? We rarely actually know ALL the facts, what they have been through in the past, what they are going through now, how much that person is hurting and what God is working on in their life at present. We need to ask ourselves: Is sharing this story helping to build up unity and love in our fellowship? Of course, there are times when someone has hurt us and we need to share this with a friend, or there is something in the fellowship which concerns us and we need to discuss it with others to decide what to do, and there are times when it is right to challenge someone for what they have said or done but we must remember Jesus words in Love each other. Just as I have 35 - John 13:34loved you, you should love each other. Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples." This principle of love must always underlie what we say to others particularly when we are being critical. It is so distressing when I hear of people who have left our fellowship because of hurtful things that have been said to them or about them. The other side of this, which, praise God, we see more often, is the opportunity to encourage each other. Our words and attitude have so much impact. It was so encouraging last Sunday to hear Eleanor saying how much the support and care she has received have impacted her life, and to have this echoed by one of our lunch guests. This is the true meaning of fellowship.

Another daily reading confronted me with a real challenge which shows the way God's kingdom turns things totally upside down! Even to have such lawsuits with one another is a defeat for you. Why not just accept the injustice and leave it at that? Why not let yourselves be cheated? 1 Corinthians 6:7 This is discussing a situation where two Christians are in dispute. In their case it had got as far as the court. The startling thing is Paul addresses and rebukes the one who is in the right! Jesus, our Saviour, totally faultless, went to the cross willingly, without complaint, praying for forgiveness for those doing it as he went! This is the greatest gift God could give us! He asks us to do the same! Perhaps the greatest gift you can give to this church is to accept an injustice to yourself without complaint and without harbouring resentment.
