CONCERNS OF ASSISTED DYING BILL COMMITTEE CHANGES.

There has been much criticism of the Committee by the media and MP's across the parties. Here is just a couple of examples:

Kim Leadbeater has decided to do away with her own much promoted safeguard and dispense with the need for someone's death to be signed off by a High Court Judge. This was one of the main reasons many MPs voted for the Bill. Now it is to be a panel of experts overseen by a Voluntary Assisted Dying Commission led by a Court Judge which means the impartial and legal safeguard of a Court Judge signing off individual cases will be missing.

The Bill has been criticised particularly over the definition of terminal illness; currently someone would only be able to access Assisted Suicide if they were a consenting adult over 18 years old, and had a terminal illness which meant that they had under 6 months to live, according to a doctor's prognosis. However, in other jurisdictions around the world, this has meant Assisted

Suicides being greenlit for conditions which would not normally be thought of as terminal illness, including diabetes, arthritis and anorexia. Labour MP Naz Shah proposed an amendment which would have clarified that someone who "would not otherwise" qualify as terminally ill "shall not be considered to meet those requirements as a result of stopping eating or drinking." But this amendment was rejected by a majority of the Committee.

The arbitrary "six months to live" is being put forward on the Committee by some as could be less than six months. So the slippery slope is actually being seen in the Committee Stage. Sadly this Bill is being rushed through and expected to be voted on in Parliament in April.

Thought for the Week Money

We have heard quite a bit about church finances recently so I thought I would look at what The Bible has to say about money. It turns out there is a vast amount! So I have picked out just a few texts to consider:

Jesus said you cannot serve both God and money Matthew 6:24 For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. 1 Timothy 6:10

There is no suggestion that there is anything wrong with having money, it is entirely our attitude to it that matters.

'The silver is mine and the gold is mine,' declares the Lord Almighty. Haggai 2:8

This one is a reminder that I am not really giving God a bit of MY money, only deciding how much of what He has given me I will spend on myself! God

loves to give generously and it is right to enjoy His gifts, spend enough on ourselves to live well, have holidays..., and also to provide for our families' future. But we also need to be generous in what we give. When someone gives you a gift, they hope you will enjoy it, not give it away! But some gifts are meant for sharing!

Bring all the tithes into the storehouse so there will be enough food in my Temple. Malachi 3:10 I was brought up with the idea of "tithing", based on the Old Testament teaching - one tenth of everything I receive should be given to God. I still believe this is an excellent starting point but it is only a starting point! The tithe was required, but on top of this was the sin offering, the thanks offering and numerous other special offerings! Obviously we don't need to make a sin offering, but perhaps the thanks offering should be much areater!

You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. "For God loves a person who gives cheerfully." 2 Corinthians 9:7

On the first day of each week, you should each put aside a portion of the money you have earned. Don't wait until I get there and then try to collect it all at once. 1 Corinthians 16:2

So we need to pray about our giving, plan it and put it aside

A few practical suggestions

- 1. Giving is a priority. I find it best to separate it out as soon as possible. I use standing orders, some to specific charities and some into a Charities Aid Fund account for distributing later.
- 2. Make use of Gift Aid where possible. There are few areas

where we can directly control the Government, but we can make them give money to the charities we support!

- 3. Give a lot of thought to who you support. Probably our first and greatest obligation is to our own church. After that, consider specifically Christian organisations which will get less public support.
- 4. It is not possible to give to every need. A significant gift to an organisation you really care about and pray for is better than lots of little gifts.
- 5. Be generous and spontaneous with extra unplanned giving.
- 6. We also give in many other ways than simply sending money: hospitality, food parcels, giving lifts, bringing stuff in for groups, not claiming all our church expenses, sponsoring walks...

Nicky Gumbell: Your attitude towards money is a barometer of your whole outlook on life. John Wesley: Earn all you can. Save all you can. Give all you can.

So to finish let's read the full text of Malachi 3:10

Bring all the tithes into the storehouse so there will be enough food in my Temple. If you do," says the Lord of Heaven's Armies, "I will open the windows of heaven for you. I will pour out a blessing so great you won't have enough room to take it in! Try it! Put me to the test!
