

Help for Ukraine


Dave Chesill is again going to drive a truck to the Ukraine in June. This will be the 24th time they have done this.

Thought for the Week

Working Together

We will I'm sure all be aware of the words of Paul in 1 Corinthians 12 where he speaks about a body with many parts.

12 "There is one body, but it has many parts. But all its many parts make up one body. It is the same with Christ. 13 We were all baptized by one Holy Spirit. And so we are formed into one body. It didn't matter whether we were Jews or Gentiles, slaves or free people. We were all given the same Spirit to drink. 14 So the body is not made up of just one part. It has many parts.

15 Suppose the foot says, "I am not a hand. So, I don't belong to the body." By saying this, it cannot stop being part of the body. 16 And suppose the ear says, "I am not an eye. So, I don't belong to the body." By saying this, it cannot stop being part of the body. 17 If the whole body were an eye, how could it hear? If the whole body were an ear, how could it smell? 18 God has placed each part in the body just as he wanted it to be. 19 If all the parts were the same, how could there be a body? 20 As it is, there are many parts. But there is only one body."

We will no doubt have heard the important and true application of this that we all have different skills, talents

and abilities. Just as an eye and a foot have very different uses as part of our bodies, each of us as part of God's Church and our own church here at DBC have different skills and roles which we are to use to honour God. Each role is as important as the other. Those that serve God and his people by quietly serving tea and coffee each Sunday are performing a role just as important as those that are more 'public facing' and all of our skills, abilities and jobs that we are called to do within the church complement each other as we make up the one body of Christ in our community.

It's also important though remember that each part of the body has to work in unison for our bodies to function as they should. For us to walk or run effectively our brain, arms and legs all need to work together trusting that each part is going to do its own job. For those of us who have ever had an injury we know how hard it is to function at 100% when we don't know if that injured body part is going to suddenly give way. In the same way for us to thrive as a church united as one body through Jesus, we all need to trust in each other as we do the jobs that we have been given in the Church. We need to rely on each other and recognise that we are most effective in serving God, our church and our community when we work fully in unison with each person and part of the church working together in sharing God's love with others. As Paul says later on in the chapter, an eye can't say to a hand I don't need you. Likewise, we all need each other and need to give thanks for the different gifts God has given us and to work together to support and encourage each other.
