


Outing to Old Moor RSPB Reserve. An outing is being organised by The Eco Group to Old Moor on:

Thought of the Week

Dearest Lord, teach me to be generous; teach me to serve You as You deserve; to give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to heed the wounds, to toil and not to seek for rest, to labour and not to ask for reward save that of knowing I am doing Your Will.

Above is a well-known prayer usually attributed to St Igneous Loyala and connected to his brand of spirituality, it is a prayer to be generous. These past weeks we have seen people being generous in their time and energy with the support for holiday club and DTI, filling in for others and so on. But we are humans and can grow weary of

being generous, of giving, of standing up for Christ, of toiling away and not always being recognised

When I read this prayer, I struggle with 'not to count the cost' and 'not to heed the wounds' because we live in a society that believes in being prepared – From going on holidays, to pension provision, which seems admirably sensible. Therefore, what is this prayer saying?

It is pointing to something much deeper about a decision around life style, priorities and identity. It is emphasizing finding God in all things, living generously, and discerning God's will through reflection and prayer. The spirituality behind the prayer, encourages a deep, personal relationship with God and a commitment to serving others. No longer are we there for merely ourselves but for the communities we belong to and the ones we encounter. It is not a call to abandon all our plans and provisions for the future but to put them into the perspective of God's calling on our lives, what can I give says the old hymn and the answer to that will have a difference according to our situations and our mission filed.

So, as we say this prayer let us re-new our commitment to be as generous as we can in our pilgrimage with God.
