

Thought for the week

'In him you are also being built together for God's dwelling in the Spirit' (Ephesians 2 verse 22)

I'm rereading 'Animal Farm' by George Orwell for the first time since I was around 15 years old at school. In Animal Farm Orwell satirises life in the Soviet Union under the rule of Stalin because he had become thoroughly disillusioned by the contrast of vision given by 'The Old Major' aka Marx to create a home fit for the workers with the reality under 'Napoleon' aka Stalin.

rereading **'Practice** Τ also am Resurrection' by Eugene Peterson. Peterson, like Orwell, is also tempted to be disillusioned but this time by the reality of the church, something I know we can all identify with. Peterson encourages us when we think and feel like this not to give up on the church but to continue to love her and he does so by teaching us to remember two things.

Firstly, we are to recognise that the church is, to use his daring phrase, by definition painfully ordinary. He's neither being negative or defeatist, instead he's just being honest. For myself I have high expectations for us as a church. I yearn, pray and preach for us to aspire as much as we can to be a people who are seeking to be and to live like Jesus. Yet, I know we are painfully ordinary. But that is okay as this is what I discover when I read the New Testament too.

Secondly, in direct contrast to the first we are to remember that God is at work in and among us and he dwells in us by his Spirit. This does not remove the ordinariness of us all, instead it is in the ordinariness that we discover the glory of God. In 2 Corinthians 4 verse 7 Paul speaks of us as vessels of clay so that we may show even more the surpassing power and glory of God.

Our ordinariness is not an excuse for us to love Jesus in a mediocre sort of way, but to realise it is how people are able to Jesus living in us the clearest. To be ordinary is not to be indifferent or unbelieving in our following of Jesus, it is to be dependent on the Spirit who lives in and among us so that we may dare to believe that we can do all things through Christ who strengthens us. To be ordinary is to know that we are all fearfully and wonderfully made and it is Christ who is at work in us that we may fulfil his good purpose.

I reread Practice Resurrection regularly for one purpose, to embrace both my ordinariness and to know the glory of Jesus in me by his Spirit. I know that sounds like two, but I like to think of it as one, like two sides of one coin. I reread it so that I may encourage all us not to despair but dare to believe that Jesus really does live in us and that he delights to be seen in and among us.
