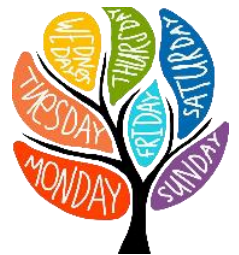

But now we see it and hear it all the time, and oh dear all those horror films on TV. It could easily be said that we are under attack.

Andy preached a cracking sermon on Sunday about standing together, being united, putting on the full armour of God and after we have done all we can, to stand.
