Thought for the Week

"He has watched over your journey through this immense wilderness.
The Lord your God has been with you... you have lacked nothing."

(Deuteronomy 2 verse 7)

This year another of my heroes who I have journeyed with throughout my ministry has died. His name is Walter Breuggemann and though he was cut from a very different theological cloth to me, I have found him to be an incredibly helpful, thought provoking and soul stirring companion on the way.

I am currently reading one of his books, called 'The Land', and something he wrote really struck me and inspired me. I hope you find it so too.

On Lacking Nothing

Israel discerns Yahweh peculiarly in the desert. He enters into the desolation with his people. He subjects himself to the same circumstances as Israel. He also sojourns without rootage, with his people, en route to the fulfilling land of promise.

Wilderness, landlessness for Israel, is a place without resources. But it is also the place where Yahweh is present with and to his people. Israel characteristically 'looked to the wilderness' and there discerns his inscrutable presence. Wilderness, precarious as it is, is where Yahweh is present. That requires a new discernment of Yahweh. It also provides a fresh understanding of wilderness, no doubt experienced only by those who discern his presence by fully facing wilderness. Others worry about food and death. But the traditions of Israel offer a remarkably different reading of Israel's experience. They draw a bold conclusion "you have lacked nothing."

Israel's reflection on that forty years of landlessness leads to a remarkable affirmation. Wilderness should have been a place of death, but life is given. Wilderness should have been a place of weariness, sickness, poverty, and disease, but Israel is sustained and kept well. Israel has no tattered clothes, no sore feet. It is subjected to the worst thinkable conditions and is kept well. The place of all lacks, because Yahweh is present, is where nothing is lacking.

Wilderness is not the place of destiny Israel or anyone else would prefer. But Israel is a people created in impossibility (Sarah) and sustained against every deathly prognosis. Israel lives only by miracle. It never decides its destiny is landlessness, but it concludes in these traditions that landlessness as a way to land is a bearable, even celebrative event because Yahweh is there with his people. And because Yahweh is there, gifts are healings emerge, given, newness governs, and nothing grows old. It is against all the wise expectations of this age, of all those who would reasonably leave Israel there to die.

As Israel discovered, may we all discover this to be true in our lives.

Gift Service - Lilies Clothes Bank

In previous years as part of the Gift Service, along with Angel Tree and the Lighthouse Project, we have donated items to the Genesis project.

This project is no more and we are replacing it with Lilies Clothes Bank which is at the Meadowhead Christian Fellowship at Jordanthorpe.

They supply Clothing, Coats and Footwear for men, women, children and babies to those who need it. The items must be in good condition and clean.

It would give the chance for people in Church to look through their clothes and see if they have any unwanted items.

If not, people could buy for about £5 or less items from Poundstretcher in the Civic such as woolly hats, gloves or socks,

Alternatively, people could go into the Charity Shops in the Civic to buy some clothes at a small price therefore helping two places for the price of one.
