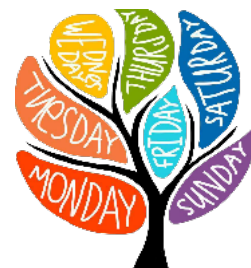

Thought for the Week

Humility Alison Bygrave

He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the a Lord require of you?

To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:8

We know that God requires us to be humble before him and towards other people. The dictionary tells me that humility is the quality of having a modest or low view of one's importance. What does Jesus say about humility? "Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another" (1 Peter 5:5). Jesus promise that God will exalt the humble (Matthew 23:12). And his apostles too say, "Humble yourselves" (James 4:10;).

While thinking about humility, I found a blog article on the internet by a lady called Elizabeth Peale Allen who says 'Humility has got a bad reputation in recent years. Many people now think it's a synonym for low self-esteem.' (Positive Living, 6 steps to Walking humbly with God.) But it is not an excuse for being pathetic or obsequious or failing to be assertive. God made us to be complete rounded people with a healthy sense of our own worth and to be those who always 'Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others'. (Philippians 2:3-4)

In her blog, Elizabeth Peale Allen gives 6 Steps for walking humbly with God. I can't possibly improve on them so I quote them here.

1. Remember who's in charge—and praise Him! It's hard to keep things in perspective if we don't remember who is Lord! ...
2. Pray for a humble heart. ...
3. Pay more attention to your own faults than to the flaws of others. ...
4. Don't hide behind your dignity—it's pride's favourite hiding place. ...
5. Try not to watch yourself worship. ...
6. Serve others

And remember: Proverbs 22:4
Humility is the fear of the LORD;
its wages are riches and honour and life.
