I was unable to attend the Lent sessions, so I bought Pete Greig's book, 'How to Hear God' to read and learn about *lectio divina*, the subject of the sessions. *Lectio divina* is (in short) an ancient way of praying, reading the Bible and trying to listen to what God is saying. As I worked my way through the book, I found this way of praying and reading brought new life to my personal devotions as I learned to give more emphasis on listening to God. I'm still learning!

I started with the Gospel of John, a small portion each day. When I got to the end I started on the book of Acts to continue with 'What happened next?' I've found this different way of doing devotions very helpful. Sometimes I've found more depth of understanding, sometimes I've been very aware of the words speaking directly to me. I have read the books of John and Acts many times, but this time the words have seemed to speak directly to me in a new way.

I've noticed Peter in particular. He started as a fisherman, probably uneducated. Jesus called him, he followed and his life was changed completely. He made mistakes and denied Jesus, but Jesus reinstated him, gave him forgiveness and a new purpose. After Peter receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, this uneducated fisherman stood up in front of crowds of people and preached an amazing sermon. No planning, no notes. He relied completely on the power of the Holy Spirit. What a transformation!

Peter also wrote 2 letters that are in the Bible. Maybe he had help from a scribe. This morning my 'verse of the day' was some of Peter's words. A verse I love, but which speaks to me as I know I fall short.

'Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins.' 1 Peter 4v8
