Have you ever heard of **The Eternal Wall of Answered Prayer?**

I heard a report about it on Premier Christian Radio.



It's in the process of construction and plans are for it to be completed by 2028. It is to be situated near Coleshill Warwickshire and will be visible from both the M6 and the M42, standing at 51 metres high (168 feet), more than twice the height of the Angel of the North.

It will comprise of one million bricks digitally (you have to point your phone at it) linked to individual stories about how God has been answering and keeps on answering our prayers.

The foundations are being prepared on site and the white marble structure is being built in Portugal.

The monument aims to be a place of hope and inspiration commemorating the faithfulness of God in individual lives.

The Eternal Wall is designed to be both a National landmark and a digital archive.

Sometimes we wonder how much, as a Christian country, we are seen to be standing by our faith, I am inspired and encouraged by this massive project and pray that many people will be drawn to our loving Saviour because of it.
